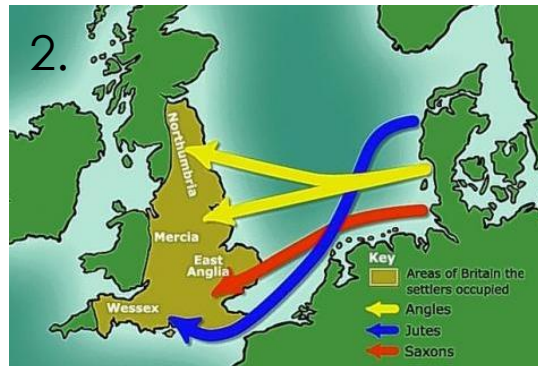
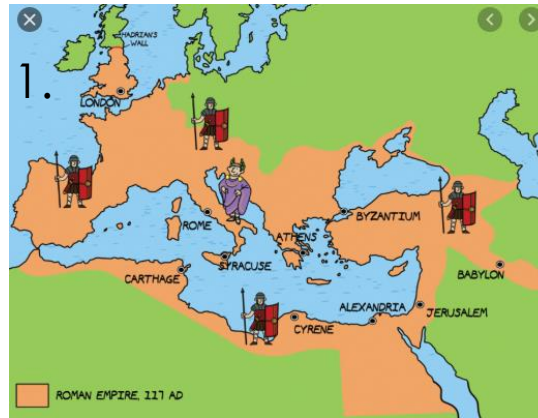
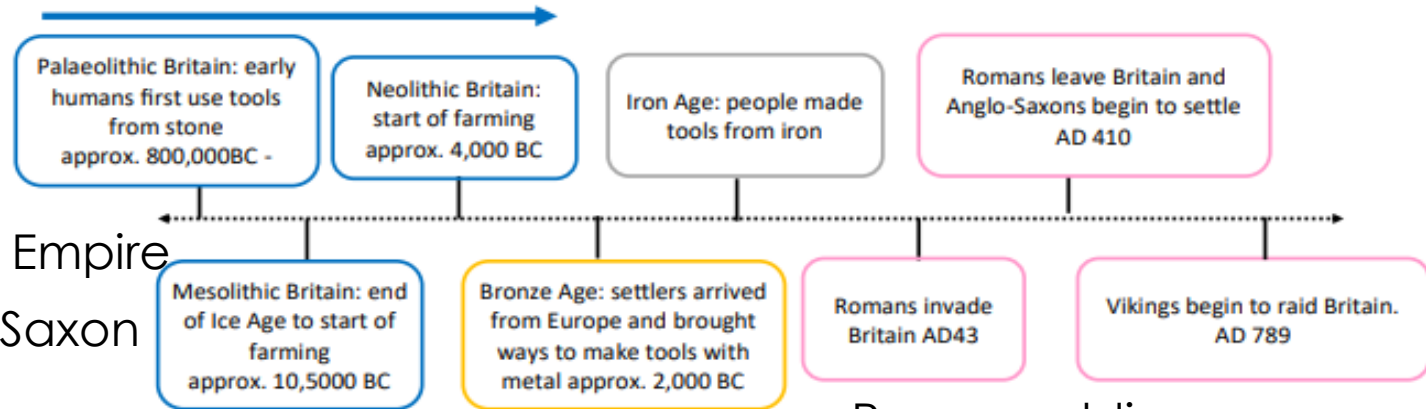

Vocabulary	
<b>archaeology</b>	the study of human history and prehistory through the excavation of sites and the analysis of artefacts and other physical remains.
<b>artefacts</b>	an object made by a human being, typically one of cultural or historical interest.
<b>culture</b>	the ideas, customs, and social behaviour of a particular people or society.
<b>empire</b>	an extensive group of states or countries ruled over by a single monarch, an oligarchy, or a sovereign state.
<b>invasion</b>	an instance of invading a country or region with an armed force.
<b>kingdom</b>	a country, state, or territory ruled by a king or queen.
<b>Latin</b>	the language of ancient Rome and its empire, widely used historically as a language of scholarship and administration.
<b>rebellion</b>	an act of armed resistance to an established government or leader
<b>resistance</b>	the refusal to accept or comply with something.
<b>settlement</b>	a place where people establish a community.
