EYFS in the spotlight

Welcome to another exciting catch-up with the Rockpool, as we delve into the marvellous activities and adventures our Nursery and Reception have been engaged in this half-term.



With our commitment to fostering environmental awareness, we introduced the story

'The Life of a Little Plastic Bottle'. This thought-provoking story served as a gentle reminder of the importance of caring for our planet and making sustainable choices. Through this story, our children learned about the impact of plastic pollution and the significance of recycling. It sparked meaningful discussions about the ways in which we can all play a part in preserving our environment for future generations.

Continuing with our exploration of the natural world, we embarked on an underwater adventure with 'Commotion in the Ocean'. Through engaging poems and descriptive language, our children discovered the fascinating creatures that inhabit the deep blue sea. They delighted in creating their own imaginative sea creatures, using vibrant language and vivid descriptions to bring their creations to life. This imaginative exercise not only enhanced their reading and writing skills but also fuelled their curiosity about sea creatures and their environment.



Another captivating story that we enjoyed was 'Tiddler' by Julia Donaldson. This enchanting story took us on an aquatic journey with Tiddler, a fish known for his tall tales. Our children were enthralled by Tiddler's imaginative adventures and egaerly participated in activities that inspired their storytelling and creativity. This story not only sparked their imagination but also emphasised the importance of honesty and the power of story telling as a means of connection and




engagement.
